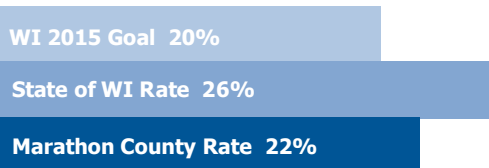

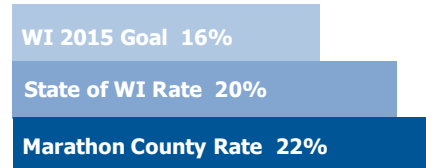
50-75% of cancer deaths are caused by our behaviors

Cancer incidence	2005-2009	<p>Rate: 5 year age-adjusted rate represents the average number of cases per 100,000 population.</p> <p>Significance: A county's incidence rate is significantly different from the state rate if the 95% confidence intervals for the county and the state do not overlap.</p> <p>Age-adjusted: Rates have been age-adjusted to reflect the adult age distribution of the 2000 U.S. standard population. Population	2011	<p>All persons who are "usually resident" in a specified geographic area.</p> <p><i>United States Census Bureau:</i> http://www.census.gov/</p>
Unemployment rate	2011	<p>Percent of the civilian labor force, age 16 and older, that is unemployed but seeking work.</p> <p><i>Bureau of Labor Statistics:</i> http://www.bls.gov/</p>
Median income	2006-2010	<p>Median income of households. Household income is the combined income of all residents in a household over the age of 15.</p> <p><i>United States Census Bureau:</i> http://www.census.gov/</p>
Living in poverty	2006-2010	<p>Percent of the population with an income that is less than the poverty threshold. High school graduation	2006-2010	<p>Percent of the population that is 25 years of age or older with a high school diploma or its equivalent.</p> <p><i>United States Census Bureau:</i> http://www.census.gov/</p>
College degree	2006-2010	<p>Percent of the population that is 25 years of age or older with bachelor's degree from a college or university.</p> <p><i>United States Census Bureau:</i> http://www.census.gov/</p>
Population over 65	2011	<p>Percent of the population that is 65 years of age and older.</p> <p><i>United States Census Bureau:</i> http://www.census.gov/</p>
Hispanic	2011	<p>Percent of the population that classified themselves in one of the specific Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino categories. People who identify their origin as Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino may be of any race.</p> <p><i>United States Census Bureau:</i> http://www.census.gov/</p>
Racial minorities	2011	<p>Cumulative percentage of those that classified themselves as Black, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian, Native Hawaiian/Other Pacific Islander or a person reporting two or more races.</p> <p><i>United States Census Bureau:</i> http://www.census.gov/</p>
Rural	2010	<p>Percent of the population that lives in a rural area, which the U.S. Census defines as all territory located outside of urbanized areas and urban clusters. Uninsured adults	2010	<p>Percent of the adult population under age 65 that has no health insurance coverage.</p> <p><i>United States Census Bureau:</i> http://www.census.gov/</p>
Ratio of population to primary care providers	2011-2012	<p>Primary care providers include practicing physicians specializing in general practice medicine, family medicine, internal medicine, pediatrics and obstetrics/gynecology.
