Uninsured adults	2007	<p>Percent of the adult population under age 65 that has no health insurance coverage. <i>County Health Rankings 2011:</i> http://www.countyhealthrankings.org/</p>
Ratio of population to primary care providers	2008	<p>Primary care providers include practicing physicians specializing in general practice medicine, family medicine, internal medicine, pediatrics and obstetrics/gynecology. Rural	2009	<p>Percent of a county's population that lives in a rural area, which the U.S. Census defines as all territory located outside of urbanized areas and urban clusters. Postsecondary education	2005-2009	<p>Percent of the population age 25-44 with some postsecondary education, such as enrollment at vocational/technical schools, junior colleges, or four-year colleges.
